THE DUAL

William Diver

The burden of this paper is that we need a clear understanding of the dual number for a full appreciation of the literary effect of the Homeric texts.

It is generally felt that the use of the dual number in Greek is often arbitrary, not to say capricious. Usually, something is regarded as arbitrary either because it is completely chaotic or because it departs markedly from some accepted norm. In the latter case, of course, the trouble may actually be that the accepted norm should never have been set up as a norm in the first place. The norm offered by grammars of Greek is that the dual is used with natural pairs (e.g. Smyth (1920 [1956]), §999). The purpose of this paper is to show that that norm is not supported by the language itself, and that it can be replaced by another norm in respect to which the usage of the texts is not arbitrary.

Table I presents the results of a count of all instances in the Iliad of references to the natural pairs indicated: two words for eyes, one each for ears, shoulders, hands, knees, and feet.

It will be seen at a glance that the one word for eyes—ὄσσε—appears
